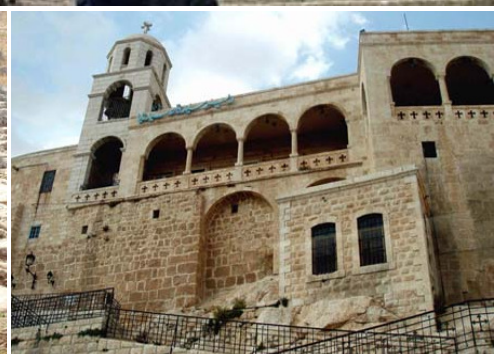

# A JOURNEY TO SYRIA WITH THE REVD IVOR SPERRING

16th - 24th September 2010

I invite you to join me in Syria in autumn 2010 for a pilgrimage which will cover many of the significant religious and cultural sites.

*“As for Damascus, she is the Paradise of the Orient, and dawning place of her resplendent light ... and the bride of the cities which we have unveiled.”*

So said the traveller Ibn Battuta visiting Damascus in the 14<sup>th</sup> century. Damascus claims to be the oldest continuously inhabited city in the world and Aleppo makes the same claim! Certainly both have long and fascinating histories. We spend three nights in Damascus, thoroughly exploring the ancient city; the vast Omayyad Mosque containing a shrine which reputedly holds the head of John the Baptist, Straight Street where St. Paul was lowered from the walls; the Azem's Palace and the Great Bazaar.

We also call at the picturesque Christian villages of Maaloula and Sednaya; both were early Christian centres and in Maaloula, until recently, Aramaic was spoken.

Palmyra, said to have been founded by King Solomon and ruled by the Assyrians and the Persians was part of Alexander the Great's empire and thrived on the Silk Route trade. Re-crossing the desert we will see the ancient water wheels of Hama and climb to the mountain top Crusader fortress of Crac des Chevaliers.

In Aleppo we stay in the lovely old traditional mansion of Dar Zamaria and from there visit the Citadel, mosque and stone vaulted bazaar. We see the 5<sup>th</sup> century church of St. Simeon Stylites who, for 38 years, lived on top of a pillar, preaching to pilgrims who flocked to the site.

The pilgrimage will mix the holy and the holiday - there will be times for worship and reflection but also for fun and relaxation. There will be plenty of time in both Damascus and Aleppo for exploring and shopping - as well as visiting many of the principal sites.

I do hope that you will come and be part of this fascinating pilgrimage.

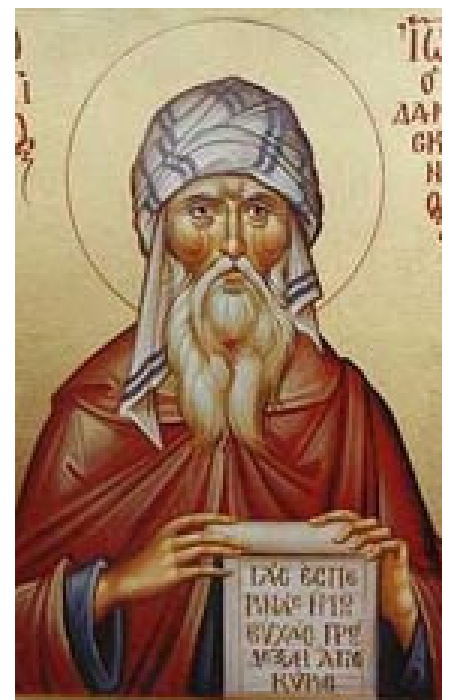


## TOUR INFORMATION

**The cost of this tour is £1,425 and is guaranteed against further surcharge.**

Our hotels are a mix of three and four star local grade and are all of a very acceptable standard and chosen for their location or atmosphere. All rooms have private facilities. The tour is **full-board** and we have included all meals in the standard price with breakfast and dinner at our hotel and lunch at a convenient restaurant on each touring day. Flights are with British Midland between London Heathrow Airport and Damascus. Touring is in air-conditioned coaches and we will be accompanied throughout by a local guide. We have also included all entrance fees, all airport and departure taxes. A group visa is issued free of charge on arrival in Syria.

The only extras to budget for are the journeys to and from London Heathrow and travel insurance premium (if required) at £49. The group gratuity fund contribution is £40 (to be collected by your tour leader in Syria). Single rooms are available and the charge is £255. Please, however, see our note 'Travelling Alone' overleaf. Any special requests should be printed on the booking form. A deposit is payable now with the balance due eight weeks prior to departure. Final flight and accommodation details will be sent with your travel wallets, two weeks before departure.





# DAILY PROGRAMME

## Thursday 16th September TO SYRIA

We fly from London Heathrow to Damascus. Our British Midland flight BD913 departs at 1330 and arrives into Damascus at 2040. **On arrival, we transfer to the Omayyad Hotel in the city of Damascus for a three night stay.**



## Friday INTRODUCTION TO DAMASCUS

We begin our two day exploration of Damascus. We spend time in the National Museum and Azem's Palace and have a lunch break in the Old City. We then follow "the Street called Straight" to the chapel of Ananias. We also see St Paul's Chapel, built into the wall from which Paul was lowered in a basket. We make a brief call at the evocative Hejaz railway station. We drive out to Kaukab Hill, a traditional site of the conversion of St Paul.

## Saturday INTRODUCTION TO DAMASCUS

In the morning we return to the Old City to see the Omayyad Mosque and the nearby Saladin's Tomb. We also have the opportunity to walk through the fascinating bazaars of the Old City.

## Sunday PALMYRA

From Damascus we drive out into the desert and Palmyra. A highlight of our tour are the magnificent remains of this second century city of Queen Zenobia. Canaanites, Arameans, Romans and Arabs have all inhabited this oasis deep in the Syrian desert. We visit the City of the Dead, the underground burial chambers, the Great Colonnade and the Temple of Bel and view the theatre and agora. **We spend one night at the Zenobia Hotel.**



## Monday HAMA & CRAC DES CHEVALIERS

We leave Palmyra and drive first to biblical Hama, with its ancient water wheels on the river Orontes. We then continue to Crac des Chevaliers, the greatest of all the Crusader castles, here we have a lunch break. **We continue to the coastal resort of Lattakia and the Cote d'Azur Resort Hotel for a one night stay.**



## Tuesday ST SIMEON AND ALEPPO

We leave the coast and drive to St Simeon's monastery, where he preached from the top of a pillar for over thirty years. The area also has a number of Dead Cities, the collective name given to a group of historical sites dating from early Byzantine Christianity. **We spend two nights in Aleppo at the Dar Zamaria Martini Hotel.**

## Wednesday ALEPPO

We spend a day touring Aleppo. The city is famous for its vast labyrinth of *souks* (bazaars) and a large Christian population, including many Armenians. We visit the Grand Mosque with Zechariah's tomb and a free-standing minaret dating back to 1090. Opposite the mosque is the Madrasa Halawiye (once St Helena's Cathedral). We may also see an example of one of the *khan* (merchants trading courtyards) and the *muristan* (hospital) al-Nuri. In the afternoon, there is opportunity to spend time in the famous *souks*.



## Thursday MAALOULA & DAMASCUS

Leaving Aleppo, we drive to Damascus. En route we spend some time in the village of Maaloula where we visit the Greek Catholic Mar Sarkis (St Sergius) Monastery and the very much alive Greek Orthodox convent of Mar Tekla. We also visit the convent in Sednaya, where an icon of the Virgin is said to have been painted by St Luke. We lunch in Maaloula. We then complete our journey to Damascus and **spend our last night in Syria at the Omayyad Hotel.** We visit the Old City for our farewell dinner together.

## Friday 24th September HOMEWARD BOUND

We drive to Damascus Airport for the return flight BD914 which departs at 0830, arriving into London Heathrow at 1320.

## TRAVELLING ALONE

Many of our passengers travel alone and object to expensive single room supplements. McCabe Pilgrimages will accept individual bookings on a 'guaranteed share' basis. We charge the basic price and accommodate you with a person of the same sex also requesting shared accommodation. If we do not find someone to share with you, you will be accommodated in a single room at only 50% of the usual single room supplement. For single travellers who do require single accommodation this should be requested when booking and, if available, the normal supplement will be payable.

## PASSPORTS, VISAS AND HEALTH

A valid passport is necessary for all our tours. It must be a full ten year passport and valid for six months after your return to the UK. Check NOW that it is valid for the duration of your tour. If you need a new passport apply NOW as there can be considerable backlogs at the passport offices. A visa is issued free of charge on entering Syria. If you are holding a different passport, or require further advice, please consult the McCabe office. [Travellers to Syria must ensure that they do not have any Israeli stamps in their passports \(or evidence of having entered Israel from a neighbouring country by land\)](#). No inoculations are required. We, however, do advise you to consult your doctor regarding your own personal requirements.

## TRAVEL INSURANCE

McCabe will arrange comprehensive travel insurance cover for each passenger unless otherwise indicated on the booking form. We have negotiated the premium (see 'Tour Information' section inside for rate) which as well as offering full medical and baggage cover also gives cover against loss of deposits. Cover is arranged by Preferential Insurance Services Ltd and is underwritten by Optimum Underwriting Limited as underwriting agents for Groupama Insurance Company Limited – each aforementioned organisation is authorised and regulated by The Financial Services Authority (FSA). The policy wording sets out full details of cover and will be sent to you with your confirmation invoice. This document also acts as your insurance certificate so that your booking reference number is also your insurance policy number.

A special feature of the McCabe insurance is that there is no age limit. Please, however, note it is a requirement that all insured persons must adhere to the Medical Health Requirements section on page 5 of the Policy wording document (which we will send you with your confirmation invoice). If you answer yes to any of the questions asked within this section you must contact the [HELPLINE 0845 250 5220](tel:08452505220). This is a confidential service that will decide whether or not this insurance is appropriate for you. If they decline to offer cover, or if you are unhappy with any aspect of the cover, you can return the policy within 14 days of issue and receive a full refund. In cases of difficulty, we have specialist insurers we can introduce you to.
