Confession

After the introduction, we join to say,

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned in thought, word and deed. We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved others as ourselves. We are absorbed in our own concerns and are impervious to what you want to show us. Too often we fail to recognise your love for us, failing to see your glory. We ask for forgiveness for the times we have stood in the way of others finding you because we have not reflected the glory of your love. On this mountain where Jesus revealed your glory, forgive us and renew us with a fresh vision of your majesty in Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Absolution is said by the priest, after which all stand.

The peace of the Lord be always with you
and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.
**All things come from you,
and of your own do we give you.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here.
His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise, holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

On this Mount of Transfiguration, open our eyes to see Jesus Transfigured here and now in this Eucharist. May we, as we receive him through this sacrament meet here and now with you as

Peter, James and John did. May we too recognize in Christ, the fulfillment of Law and Prophets, the full measure of your glory and through the cross, of your love for us. As we remember him in his suffering so we see his divinity.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and *saying:*

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;
who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, on this mountain of transfiguration where Christ revealed his glory, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:
